

Erskine Opens Fund Campaign In This Area

GASTONIA — The Gastonia and Kings Mountain Chapters of the Erskine College Alumni Association will open their solicitation for the 1970-71 Erskine College Living Endowment Tuesday, Sep-

tember 22, with a dinner meeting at 7 p.m. in the First A. R. Presbyterian Church here.

Charles H. Carlisle, vice-president for business and finance at Erskine, and Dr. Paul Sherrill of Charlotte, North Carolina Living Endowment Chairman, will be guest speakers.

Dr. and Mrs. John C. McGill are Kings Mountain Living Endowment chairmen, while Mr. and Mrs. Leonard B. McAbee, 901 Home Trial, are Gastonia campaign chairmen.

Erskine's alumni support of the Living Endowment has earned the college seven awards in the past ten years.

During the meeting alumni will learn of the \$10,000 challenge gift being made to the Living Endowment by 16 alumni and friends of the college. The challenge is based upon chapter and town participation and an increased level of giving by individual alumni.

The challenge is aimed at producing a new record in Erskine alumni giving for the third straight year. Last year's campaign received \$184,296 in contributions, with 66 per cent of all Erskine alumni—more than triple the national average—participating.

This dinner meeting will be among 40 campaign kickoff gatherings being held in six states and the District of Columbia during September and October.

Bonds Bonus Is Announced

Secretary of the Treasury David M. Kennedy, acting to implement a law signed last night by President Nixon, announced that a 1/2-percent bonus will be added to the interest rate paid to long-term holders of United States Savings Bonds.

This bonus will raise the effective interest rate on new Bonds, when held to maturity, from 5 to 5 1/2 percent.

The increase, which is retroactive to June 1, 1970, will also result in improved yields on outstanding Series E and Series H Bonds.

The millions of Americans who own Savings Bonds — including those 10 million persons who purchase them regularly through Payroll Savings Plans — will now have an extra incentive to hold onto them. For those who have not yet purchased Savings Bonds, the increase provides the added attraction of a bonus on their savings, savings that make an important contribution to the sound financing of our nation's government, Secretary Kennedy

SERIES E

Series E Bonds purchased on or after June 1, 1970, when held to maturity will receive an extra 1/2 percent, payable at maturity, raising the yield to 5 1/2 percent from date of issue to date of maturity.

Outstanding E Bonds that have not reached their first maturity will receive a 1/2-percent increase in yield for semiannual interest periods beginning on or after June 1, 1970, payable as a bonus at maturity.

Outstanding E Bonds that have reached their first maturity, or are extended beyond their first maturity while the bonus is in effect, will have the 1/2 percent credited at the end of each semiannual interest period beginning on or after June 1, 1970, through their next maturity. The bonus is payable whenever the bonds are redeemed.

SERIES H

Series H Bonds purchased on or after June 1, 1970, will yield approximately 5.12 percent for the first 5 years and 6 percent for the remaining 5 years to maturity, providing an over-all yield of 5 1/2 percent from date of issue to date of maturity.

Outstanding H Bonds that have

been held for less than 5 years will receive a 1/2-percent increase in yield for semiannual interest periods beginning on or after June 1, 1970, payable as a bonus in the form of increased semi-annual interest payments during the second 5 years to maturity.

H Bonds that have been held 5 years, or are extended while the bonus is in effect, will receive a 1/2-percent increase in yield for semiannual interest periods beginning on or after June 1, 1970. The bonus will be added to semi-annual interest checks through next maturity.
