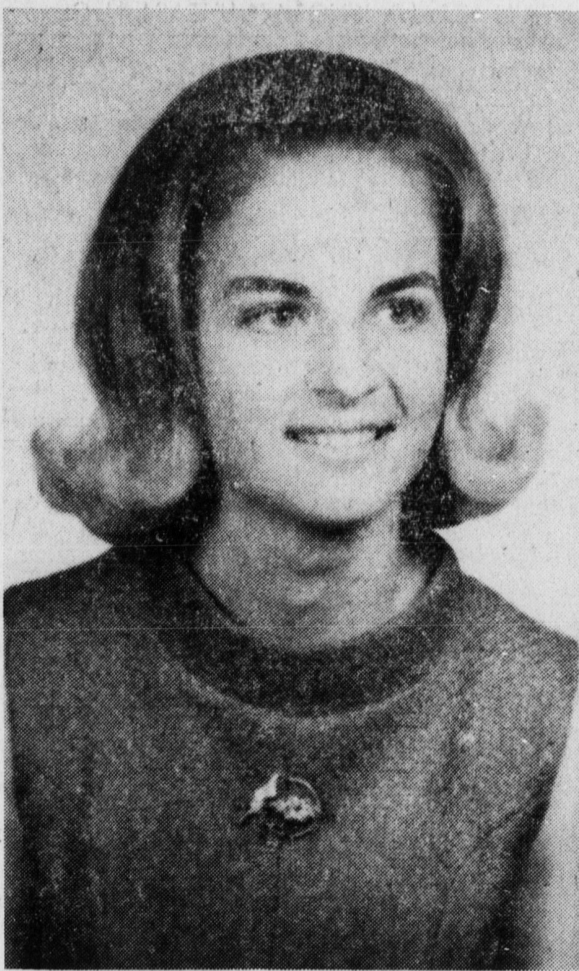
### McGinnises Fete Short-Stagey Wedding Party

### Book Club Hears Chief McDevitt On Drug Problems

Mrs. W. M. Morehead served as hostess on Thursday, October 29, at a meeting of the Thursday Afternoon Book Club at her home on Crescent Hill.

Mrs. E. W. Neal, in charge of the program, presented Thomas McDevitt who is Kings Mountain chief of police and who has had courses pertaining to the dangers of narcotics and has been associated with various organizations for curbing drug problems. Presently he is participating in the state highway safety program.

Chief McDevitt spoke on the subject "Narcotic Drugs and Their Abuses", noting that most marijuana users begin with barbiturates and later an increasing number turn to the hallucinative drugs — resulting in a spiraling death rate. In discussing the dangers of deadly drugs, he said there could be a recurrence of the "trip" on hallucination with unpredictable results. He brought out that 85 per cent of addicts were first marijuana smokers.

A question-answer period followed his remarks.

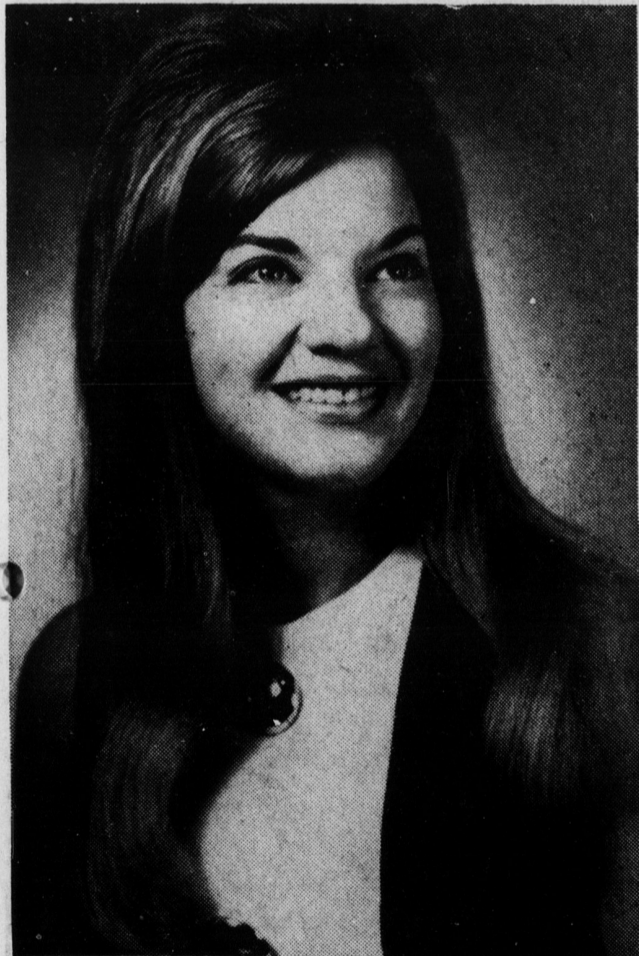
