She is a graduate of Kings Mountain high school, Cosmetic Art Beauty college and Troyanne Ross Institute of Modeling.

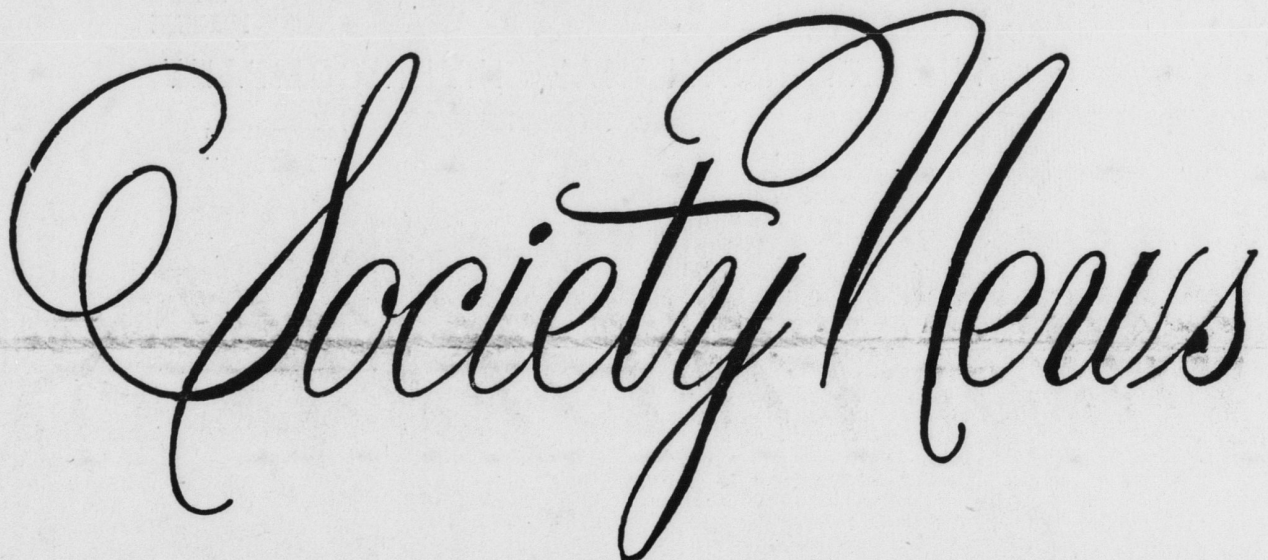


INVITATIONS ISSUED

The wedding will be an event of April 4th in Westover Baptist church of which the bridegroom-to-be's father is a former pastor.

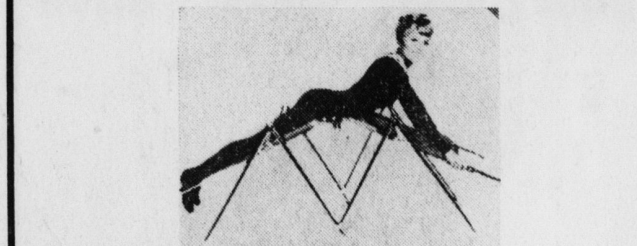
