## Rural Housing Loan Available

Residents of rural towns in the population range from 5,500 to 10,000 are now eligible to apply for rural housing loans from the Farmers Home Administration, Administrator James V. Smith of the Department of Agriculture's rural credit agency announced today.

Mr. Smith said the law has been changed to enable his agency to make loans in towns larger than the previous population limit of 5,500.

"Thousands of communities are in the category which we begin servicing today," Mr. Smith said, "and I know that our program in rural housing will expand substantially as a result of this broadened authority, allowing us to aid many more families to enjoy new homes."

The Administrator reported that during the first half of fiscal 1971 more than 51,000 rural housing loans were made for some \$624 million.

"Our total budget nationally for rural housing purposes this year is more than \$1.4 billion," Mr. Smith said. "Next year, it will go above \$1.6 billion — triple the figure for fiscal 1969. The need is pressing for improved rural housing, in nearly all states, and we are moving rapidly to meet that need."

Eligible families are those which are unable to obtain housing credit from other sources, the Administrator added.

"The Farmers Home Administration has 1,740 offices serving the nation's 3,000 rural counties," Mr. Smith said, "so that we are readily available to work directly with rural families."

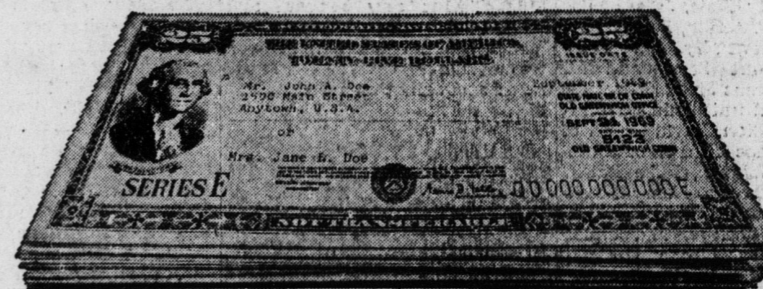
