Witnesses To Meeting

Herbert W. Elam, presiding minister of the Gastonia congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, announced today that the local congregation will attend a three-day convention, May 14-16, at Asheville High School in Asheville, North Carolina. Mr. Elam will head the local delegation of about 163 ministers.

The semi-annual event is expected to attract upwards of 1,000 ministers from Western North and the north central sector of South Carolina.

The three-day program will include a variety of talks on Bible subjects. Groups of ministers will discuss ministerial activities. Sessions will be conducted morning, afternoon and evening, with a baptism of new ministers on Saturday morning.

Mr. Elam, in describing the Bible seminar, said, "The assembly is not a revival, but is held primarily to advance Christian education."

The featured speaker on the program will be David G. Thomas, from Jehovah's Witnesses' world headquarters in Brooklyn, New York. Mr. Thomas is presently serving as district supervisor for the southeastern United States. He will deliver the principal address of the assembly on Sunday, May 16 at 2 p.m., on the subject, "What is Behind the Spirit of Rebellion?"

The public is invited to attend all sessions, free of charge.

Bancorp Announces Higher Income

First Union National Bancorp, Inc. has taken an unprecedented step emphasizing the importance of North Carolina's ecology. The Board of Directors last week approved a resolution which could affect the lending policies of First Union National Bank to business and industry if they pollute air, land or water. The resolution allows the banks to make extra money available to prevent present and future pollution.

The action is seen as a positive step in preserving the ecology by making pollution a recognized problem in industrial and commercial development and offering a solution to the problem through the use of bank credit.

The staff of the Institute for Environmental Studies at UNC-Chapel Hill has been and will continue to assist the bank in implementing the program.

C. C. Cameron, Chairman of First Union National Bancorp, will contact presidents of other banks across the state and urge them to consider similar action with their directors in an effort to involve the entire banking community in halting pollution.

BANKER'S RESOLUTION ON ECOLOGY

First, in considering requests for credit for any industrial or commercial project, First Union National Bank will, to the best of its ability, satisfy itself that, by virtue of granting such credit, no significant pollution of air, land or water will result.

Second, when significant pollution may result, we will make every effort to offer alternative programs to avoid such pollution and will stand ready to advance an amount of credit additional to the original request to finance changes necessary to carry out the alternative program, assuming the additional credit is within the ability of the customer to repay.

Third, First Union National Bank will make every effort to persuade customers who are presently polluting the air, land or water of North Carolina of the urgency of the problem and to offer additional credit to eliminate the pollution if the additional credit is within the ability of the customer to repay.

School Clinics Fridays Here

If you can not take your child to your physician, the Cleveland County Health Department has immunization clinics in Shelby each Monday, 8 a.m. to 12 Noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., and each Tuesday and Friday afternoons, 1 to 5 p.m. Other clinics are held for Upper Cleveland County each Thursday morning, 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., at the Rescue Squad Building in Lawndale, and each Friday morning, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., at the Kings Mountain New Recreation Center.

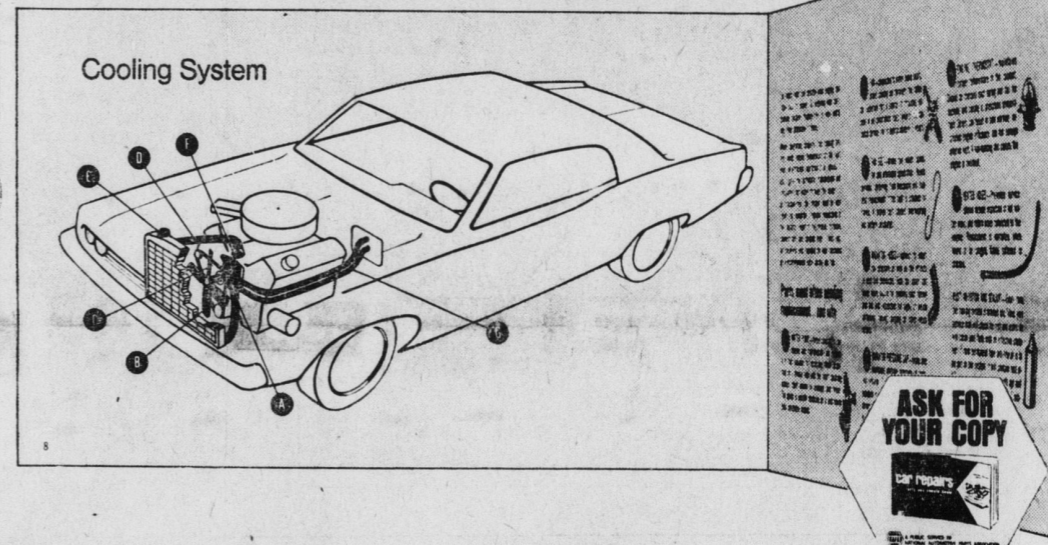

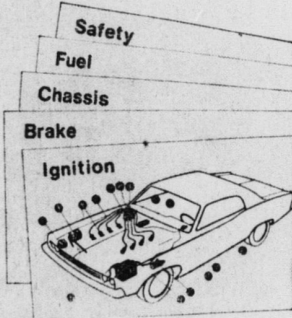
