AGANA, Guam — U. S. Air Force Staff Sergeant Gary T. Osborne, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas C. Osborne, Rt. 12, Greensboro, N. C., has been decorated with his third award of the Distinguished Flying Cross for aerial achievement in Vietnam.

Sergeant Osborne, a pararescue recovery technician, was cited for his exemplary knowledge of emergency medical aid which contributed to the successful rescue of a downed U. S. Air Force pilot near Da Nang Air Base.

He was honored at Andersen AFB, Guam, where he now serves with a unit of the Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service which performs combat and mercy air rescue and evacuation.

The sergeant is a 1964 graduate of Pleasant Garden High School.

Over 300 In Cancer Group Survey Reports

Over 300 women died of cervical cancer in North Carolina last year. Cervical cancer can be completely cured if detected early enough, according to Dr. J. Grant, chief of the chronic disease section of the N. C. State Board of Health.

In order to make the detection service available to more women, 36 nurses from throughout the state will gather at the Durham County Health Department during the next three weeks to learn how to take a Pap smear—a procedure usually done by physicians.

The Pap smear is a quick and painless method of identifying early evidence of cervical cancer before it spreads.

Funded by the N. C. Regional Medical Program and sponsored by the N. C. State Board of Health, the training course is divided into three one-week sessions. Each group is composed of 12 nurses from county health departments.

The training will enable public health nurses to initiate cancer control programs as part of the local health department's continuing efforts to control the disease. They will be in a position to offer Pap smears to local residents in all walks of life.
