



Disney Show All New Cast February 2

CHARLOTTE. — The all-new and different edition of "Disney On Parade" for 1972 which appears February 2 through 6 at the Charlotte Coliseum for nine performances, brings more than 100 favorite Disney classics and characters alive on stage to delight all ages.

This year's show is still a live 2 1/2-hour musical based on the fantasy and magic that is always Walt Disney, but this third edition brings to life brand new stories—like "The Aristocats," "Sleeping Beauty," "Winnie the Pooh," and "The Three Caballeros"—all new for 1972.

"Disney On Parade" has been in existence only two years, yet already it has become known throughout the world as wholesome family entertainment. The first edition of "Disney On Parade" is now playing to record crowds in Australia and New Zealand. Another edition will be traveling to Western Europe in July of this year. This new show will play to 42 cities throughout this country as well as Canada and Mexico before moving to another hemisphere.

The cast—all professional dancers—specialty performers, and stage crew fly from city to city, but the scenery, props, and elaborate costumes (more than 300) are transported in ten huge trucks—two of which house the world's largest portable stage (135x56 feet in dimension).

Special music was developed for the show by composer-musician Paul Weston who has worked with Tommy Dorsey and Henry Mancini through 35 years of music background. Choreography was handled by Tom Hansen whose credits range from extensive television work for the Red Skelton, Tim Conway, and Danny Kaye shows, to specials for such names as Bob Hope, Frank Sinatra and Juliet Prowse. Major production numbers this

year include "Mickey's Revue," "Sleeping Beauty," "The Aristocats," "Winnie the Pooh," and many more. Goofy returns with Herbie the Love Bug, but this time with a whole family of Love Bugs: Gorgeous Gloria and Herbie Junior, who's just a chip off the old cylinder at that. Mickey Mouse combines his musical talents with old favorites Donald Duck and Clara Cluck.

The entire show goes French for a look at Parisian life at the turn of the century with an assorted bunch of "Aristocats." The original film version is translated to the stage complete with Duchess and her beloved Kittens and O'Malley the Alley-Cat. Charming O'Malley leads his charges for a swinging look at Parisian life where everybody wants to be a cat.

"Winnie the Pooh" celebrates his birthday this year with his comic companions Eeyore, Tigger, Piglet, Kanga and Roo. It's a birthday party all right, and Winnie stuffs himself with too much honey and is doomed to a case of the "heffalumps and woozles."

"The Three Caballeros" segment takes on a Latin beat as Donald Duck is joined by old friends Panchito and Jose Carioca on a South American adventure. This major production number features exotic tropical settings and costumes, unique Latin music and the sounds of rare Brazilian instruments for authentic rhythms.

The evening is capped by the "Small World Finale" with the entire cast joining the Three Caballeros in a spectacular whirl of dancing, color and fiesta-making.

TAXPAYERS ASK IRS

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers. The column answers questions most frequently asked by taxpayers.

Q.—What is the personal exemption for 1971?
A.—The Revenue Act of 1971 increased the allowance for personal exemption to \$675 for the 1971 tax year.

Q.—My son earned more than \$675 from a summer job last year. Can I still claim him as a dependent?
A.—If your son was a full-time student regardless of age for some part of each of any five months of 1971 or was less than 19 years old at the end of the year, you can claim him as a dependent regardless of how much money he made, provided you meet all the other dependency tests, including furnishing over one-half of your son's total support.

Q.—I received a refund on my 1970 state income tax in 1971. Do I have to report this as income on my 1971 Federal income tax return?
A.—You must include in income for the year of receipt that part of the refund that gave you a tax benefit in the earlier year. For example, if you took a deduction for state income taxes on your 1970 Federal income tax return and received the full benefit of the deduction through a reduction in tax, you must include the refund as income on your 1971 Federal return. On the other hand, if you did not deduct state income taxes on your 1970 Federal return, the refund is not to be included on your 1971 Federal return.

Q.—Are all medical expenses deductible?
A.—No. Except for medical insurance premiums, only those unreimbursed medical expenses you paid that exceed three percent of your adjusted gross income are deductible. In addition, medical expenses are deductible only if you itemize your deductions. You may deduct one-half of your medical insurance premiums up to \$150 without regard to the three percent limitation with the balance also deductible subject to the three percent rule.

Q.—How much money can I earn before I have to file a Federal income tax return?
A.—You must file a Federal income tax return if you are single and had income of \$1,700 or more last year (\$2,300 if you are 65 or older) or if you are married and you and your spouse's combined is \$2,300 or more (\$2,900 if one spouse is 65 or older, \$3,500 if both of you are 65 or older). If you are self-employed and had net earnings from self-employment of \$400 or more, you must file a Federal income tax return.

Q.—Will the IRS still figure any tax for me?
A.—If your adjusted gross income is \$20,000 or less and consists only of wages or salaries and tips, dividends, interest, pensions, and annuities, the IRS will be glad to compute your tax at your request. However you must take the standard deduction instead of itemizing your deductions, fill in certain lines, and file your return by April 17, to have the IRS do the figuring for you. Be sure to read the instructions that come with the Form 1040 as to the lines that have to be completed.

Q.—When will I get my W-2 form from my employer? I can't file my income tax return without it.
A.—Employers are required to furnish their employees Wages and Tax Statements, Forms W-2, by January 31, 1972.
