TAXPAYERS ASK IRS

This column of questions and answers on federal tax matters is provided by the local office of the U. S. Internal Revenue Service and is published as a public service to taxpayers.

Q.—What effect will the new tax law have on the amount of tax withheld from my paycheck in 1972?

A.—As a result of changes in the withholding system for 1972, single employees earning up to \$25,000 a year and married employees, whose spouses are not employed, with earnings up to \$20,000 a year, can generally expect to have their full tax withheld.

Bell's Solution To Burned-Out Lights, Lamps

Where were you when the lights went out? R. B. Moore, local Southern Bell manager says that Bell Laboratories has developed a solution to the problem of burned out lamps in telephones and switchboards.

The lamp, made from a chemical compound called gallium phosphide, is a solid, transparent material that resembles amber. When a small electric current is passed through a suitably prepared crystal, the gallium phosphide gives off a bright red or green light with almost no heat.

The tiny crystal device, called a light-emitting diode, resulted after years of research and development by Bell Labs scientists and Western Electric engineers explained Moore. The new lamp will be used in future telephones, switchboards, PBXs, electronic switching systems, and display boards. In addition, explains Moore the new light is compatible with solid-state circuits.

There are several possibilities for future use that scientists are still exploring. Using the new lamps in a format that forms letters and numbers, a telephone of the future could have a readout that forms letters and numbers, a telephone of the future could have a readout panel that would allow a caller to dial a code when he comes home, and see the phone numbers of the people who called while he was out; dial a bank and see his balance; or call a computer, put in a problem and see the answer immediately.

Moore concludes, "This is a good example of how research and development by Bell Labs benefits Southern Bell and its customers. With all its advantages, the light-emitting diode seems to have a very bright future with Southern Bell and the Bell system."
