

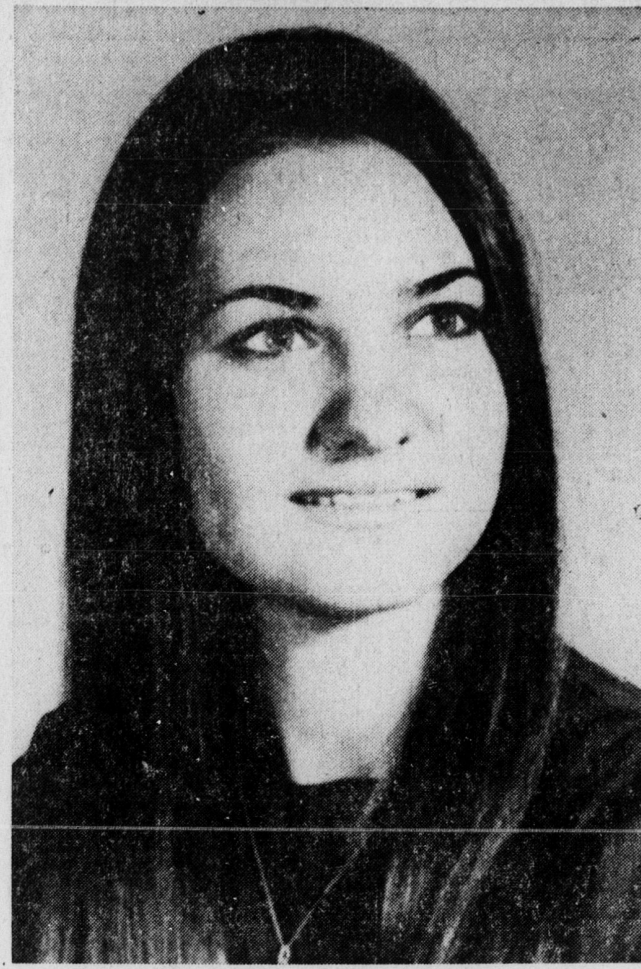

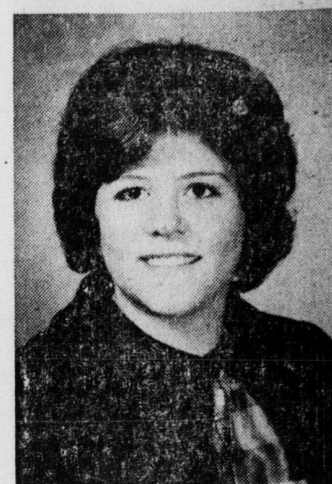

A party was held at the Morrow home in Shelby. Shawn's decorated birthday cake was cut and served with party refreshments.

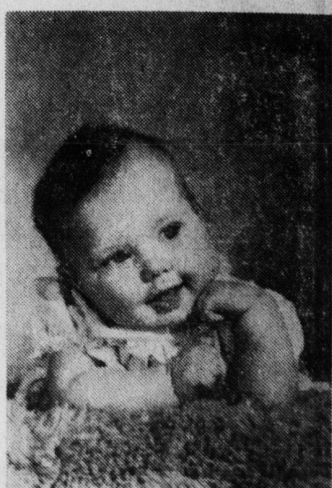
