State Representative John Ingram, in an address to a Belmont civic club, rapped the recent insurance rate in-

Ingram, a candidate for Insurance Commissioner asked following the first increase, "How many more secrets are in store for the people of North Carolina?". This 7.7% liability hike was followed by a fire insurance increase. These rate increases were made three weeks prior to the price freeze in July, 1971 and were not revealed until April,

Ingram said the people were fed up with the high cost of insurance and that he would support any responsible planno fault or otherwise - but he has the best plan. As Insurance Commissioner he will reduce car insurance by onethird for every safe driver in North

Representative Ingram is the only Candidate not connected with the insurance industry. As Insurance Commissioner, he will abolish the discriminatory Assigned Risk Pool and replace it with a better fair insurance plan.-No drunk driver will drive cheaper than a safe driving youth or anyone else-Each person will be rated on his individual driving record—He will reduce substantially the cost of car insurance for every safe driver in North Carolina.
