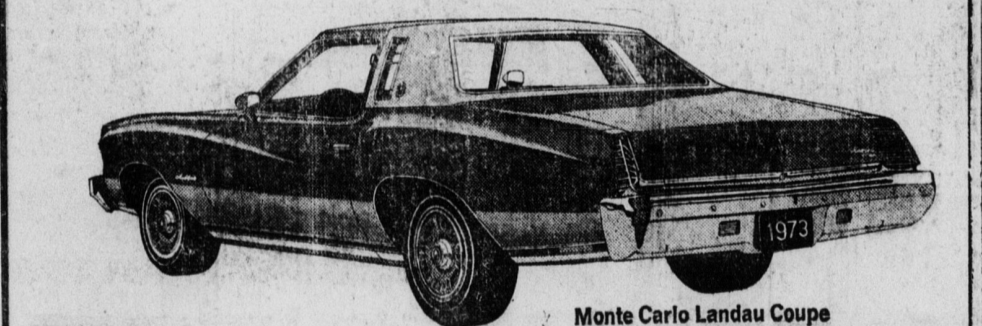

New Life After She Learned How To Read

Learning to read has meant almost a totally new life, at least for one Durham county homemaker enrolled in the Expanded Nutrition Education Program. She is receiving instructions from a volunteer reading instructor of the Yates Baptist Association.

The proud homemaker told Mrs. Mary Jane Whitmore, associate home economics extension agent, "Shopping for groceries is a lot easier for me now that I can read."

"I used to have to ask others in the grocery store to tell me what was on the labels and I memorized colors and looked at pictures. But now that I can read, it takes less time and besides I have money," she added.

According to Mrs. Whitmore, many other Expanded Nutrition Program homemakers are being referred to the volunteer organization for free private help in reading.

SPECIAL STORAGE
There's at least one Johnston county couple that believe "nothing should go to waste."

So when their old electric range burned out, they converted it into kitchen storage.

The husband, who worked in a cabinet shop, removed the surface units and controls from the range and covered the top with a piece of discarded formica.

The oven provides storage space for kitchen utensils, explains Mrs. Trudy Benson, extension program aide in the county's Expanded Nutrition Education Program.

The homemaker, Well, she makes no bones about being proud of her "new" cabinet, Mrs. Benson notes.

SELF DEFENSE
Extension Homemakers Club members in Anson county are learning the art of Self Defense.

First part of the program consists of safety tips to practice when at home, walking, driving or riding.

The second part includes films showing self defense techniques such as the palm and knee blow; the concluding portion consists of a short crossword puzzle related to defense tips.

Responses after the program were varied, says Dianne Stanley, assistant home economics extension agent. But each woman agreed she was more aware of potential danger and had learned valuable tips and techniques to use in defending and protecting herself.

SOW EFFICIENCY
One of the ways North Carolina hog farmers are making progress and becoming some of the country's leading producers is through sow efficiency. By reducing the pig weaning age from six or seven weeks to four or five weeks and rebreeding the cow four or five days after the pigs are weaned, the cow can be kept on a two-litter-a-year schedule.
