Carcass Data Service is available to North Carolina beef producers to help them receive valuable quality information from the animals they produce. Breeders can attach numbered tags to calves before selling them. The tags, obtained from the Carcass Data Service through the Beef Cattle Improvement Program at N. C. State University, go with the calf matter how many times the animal is sold before it is slaughtered. At slaughter in a U. S. inspected plant, carcass data is recorded and sent to the original owner. He uses the information to evaluate breeding stock.
