Long Agenda Of City Board; Zoning Matters, Other Requests

The city commission considered and acted upon a wide variety of city business during a 28-item agenda Monday night.

Bob Maner, assistant scoutmaster of Troop 92, opened the regular board meeting with prayer and was recognized along with members of his troop who visited the meeting.

The board referred to the Zoning Board a request for rezoning property on Highway 74 from R-20 to general business by Mrs. Ruby Hull Gorell.

Referred to the Zoning Board a request for rezoning property on Highway 74 from R-20 to general business by Ray W. Lutz of Shelby Investment Company for building an office for City Ice and Fuel Co.

Referred to the Zoning Board a request by Hal Morris to rezone property on Highway 74 from R-20 to general business for an addition to Hardin-Bumgardner Auto Repair.

Referred to the Zoning Board a request by George Ruppe to rezone property off Ruppe Street from general business to heavy industry for the purpose of constructing a hosiery plant.

Referred to the planning and zoning boards a request from the Phillips Development Corporation to rezone property in the north-eastern section of Kings Mountain from R-20 to R-6 on nine acres and from R-20 to R-10 on 24.893 acres for a proposed subdivision.

Granted a request to transfer one taxi franchise from Mrs. S. O. Kirby to William Orr.

Received bids on an electric ledge accounting machine from the Burroughs Corp. and the National Cash Register company and tabled awarding the bid until the

Dec. 28 meeting.

Accepted a low bid of \$6,656 from the Vorth Ketter Co., of Charlotte for a reloading refuse compaction unit for the sanitation department. Other bids received were Quality Equipment & Supply Co., \$6,682 and Roach-Russell Co., \$7,891.

Accepted a low bid of \$7,149.10 from the Dalton Trac Sales Inc. for a truck cab and chassis for the rear loading compaction unit. Other bids were Dixie Chevrolet, \$7,322.03 and Wade Ford Inc., \$8,395.

Approved a proposal by the Duke Power Co. to furnish power at the city's new delivery point "two" off the York Road on a five-year contract.

Voted to advertise and receive bids at the first meeting in January for a tractor with a ditcher attachment for the gas department.

Approved having Pometer Associates do a water ressure and flow survey for the city.

Voted to repair the 1923, 500,000-gallon water storage tank located on Piedmont Avenue.

Approved an informal contract with H & S Contractors for installing six eight-inch valves under pressure for the city's oldest water line — located on Piedmont Avenue.

Passed a resolution requesting approval of an application for state funds under the Clean Water Bond Act for the city's sewer improvement project. The resolution requests the state provide 25 per cent of the funds. The state has recommended to the Environmental Protection Agency approval of \$477,130 in federal funds, according to the mayor. Total cost of the project is approximately \$768,410 with the city's share some \$22,253.

Voted to advertise for a public hearing to be held Dec. 28 on a request from Karl M. Jacoby and Elise H. Jacoby for annexation of property on Edgemont Drive.

Approved the following requests for tax refunds under the Homestead Exemption: John R. Pearson, John W. Foster Sr., Mrs. Bryte Ware.

Approved a six months leave of absence recommended by Chief Tom McDevitt for a city policeman, Craig Barker in order that Parker can attend UNC-Charlotte.

Approved a request by Champion Landscaping and Excavating Company to use the city stadium for a semi-pro football team and renewing the arrangement the city had with the same firm for a semi-pro softball team.

Tabled for further study a letter from Haj S. Poonk and Thom-

as W. Harper concerning street improvements in the Ashley Park subdivision.

Voted to set holidays for city employees as follows: Dec. 20 through Christmas; Dec. 30 through Jan. 1 for New Year's. The board also voted to give Christmas bonuses based on the same procedure as used in the past.

Accepted a report from Commissioner W. S. Biddix, chairman of the insurance committee. The board will study the committee's recommendations that the city's insurance be put out to bid and that fringe benefits through Palmetto Life Insurance Co. for city employees be started.

Grigg Garage will remain closed until January 3 due to the illness of Owner-Manager Frank Hamrick who suffered a broken right leg at work three weeks ago.


Mr. Hamrick continues to improve and will reopen for business as usual on January 3.
