M. on the 12th day of February, 1973, at the office of the Redevelopment Commission, receive sealed proposals for the purchase and development of the following described real estate located in the Central Business District Urban Renewal Area, Project No. N. C. R-84 Kings Mountain, North Carolina:

Boundary description of Parcel No. 15  
A parcel of land in Kings Mountain Township, Cleveland County, State of North Carolina, located in the Central Business District Urban Renewal Project No. N. C. R-84, shown as Parcel 15 on a plat prepared by The East Engineering Company DE-51GN, dated October, 1969, and being more particularly described as follows:

will be evaluated on the basis of the bid price on the land, and the total development proposal, which, with due respect to the general public welfare and proper development of the community, will result in the greatest assessed valuation of ad valorem taxation, the greatest beneficial effect on neighboring property, the project area, and the community as a whole, and will tend to induce greater investment in the development of other property in the area, and will facilitate the relocation of persons or firms displaced by redevelopment projects to a greater degree and is within the scope of the Master Plan of the City of Kings Mountain and within the intent and spirit of the North Carolina Urban Redevelopment Law.

Proposals shall be accompanied by a good faith deposit in an amount equal to ten (10) percent of the bid price, said deposit being in cash or a certified check drawn on a bank or Trust Company authorized to do business in North Carolina or on a bank insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or a U. ## THE TAR HEEL SPOTLIGHT

Department Of Art, Culture And History

Locating sources of information on North Carolina history at the grass roots levels is made much easier by a recently published bibliography of local history.

Written by George Stevenson, an employee of the State Archives, and published by the Department of Art, Culture and History, the 82-page booklet offers several sources of information about local history in each of our one hundred counties.

This is not the first attempt to compile a concise list of references to local Tar Heel history. In 1952 a mimeographed listing of county histories was compiled by the well-known author and historian William S. Powell who was then himself an archives employee. Revised and republished in 1954, 1957, and 1963, the Powell bibliography rapidly became an indispensable reference for those interested in the history of North Carolina's counties. The fourth and final edition was published by the UNC Library at Chapel Hill.

Listings in Powell's bibliography were limited to county histories published in book form, soil surveys published by the Federal government, and articles from the State magazine. These limitations were also generally retained by historian Hugh T. Loefer in a bibliography section of "A Guide to the Study and Reading of North Carolina History" published in 1969 by the UNC Press.

The new publication by George Stevenson has altered considerably the limits of selectivity and is offered as a bibliography of local history as opposed to a bibliography of county histories. Included are references to social, economic, archaeological, town, biographical and institutional histories and studies, edited histories, journals and letters, abstracts of county records, compilations of marriage and death notices, and even commonplace inscriptions—in short, complete studies and published sources dealing with local history.

The bus will be on the campus of Gardner-Webb college Tuesday afternoon conducting tours from 1 o'clock to 5 o'clock in connection with the Gardner-Webb Travel Forum series. This month's Travel Forum will be on England. The bus will be on campus courtesy of EOAC Airlines and television station WBTV in Charlotte.

The English department of Gardner-Webb is sponsoring a campus visitation of area high school students. Several representatives of the college will be available Tuesday afternoon to talk with students who are interested in attending Gardner-Webb.
