"MONTHS OF SUNDAYS"

The State Library, admission is free.

Under the overall title of "Months of Sundays," the series will present a variety of attractions such as films, speakers, performances, and craft demonstrations in pottery, weaving and spinning, and the like.

During March and April, "Months of Sundays" will feature a series of movies on the history of the motion picture. Some will stone age to space age, there is a series of special programs every Sunday afternoon at three o'clock. Sponsored jointly with examples of screen classics.

Each program will be shown in the auditorium of the Archives and History State Library building (which also houses the State Museum of History) at 109 East Jones street in Raleigh. Each program will last approximately an hour.

The first program on March 4 will feature two documentaries entitled "Film Firsts" and "The Fun Factory." Among the "firsts" demonstrated will be an excerpt from the first "talkie," the screen's first kiss, the first cowboy star, "Bronco Billy" Anderson, and examples of early film work by such people as Thomas Edison and D. W. Griffith. "The Fun Factory" is the story of Mack Sennett's rise from movie extra to stardom. It also tells the story of his studio which produced the Keystone Kops and created such stars as Ben Turpin, Carole Lombard and Charlie Chaplin.

It is hoped that the "Months of Sundays" program series will attract local people in the Raleigh area as well as those who might drive in from some distance for a Sunday visit to our capital city. Other interesting places to visit in walking distance of the Museum of History are the Museum of Art, the Museum of Natural History, the Capitol and the Legislature Building.

JAYCEES GRANT

Nationwide efforts of the United State Junior Chamber of Commerce to combat alcoholism are being supported by a \$286,910 grant from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

The funds will aid Jaycees' efforts to mobilize the concern and resources of local communities in the fight against alcohol abuse and alcoholism.

The announcement of the award stressed the importance of government-private sector cooperation and acclaimed the cooperation between the Jaycees and the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism, an agency of the National Institute of Mental Health. NIMH is a component of HEW's Health Services and Mental Health Administration.

It is essential to enlist the widest support and assistance of private citizens in the attack on alcoholism, the announcement also said.

Tech Slates New Courses

Cleveland County Technical Institute in cooperation with the American Hotel-Motel Association will begin the first of a series of six courses leading to certification in hotel-motel training. Students passing each of the courses will receive certification from the American Hotel-Motel Association.

The initial course, "Front Office Procedure," will begin on the Cleveland Tech campus March 12 at 7:00 p.m. and will be limited to twenty (20) participants. The class will meet for two hours each Monday and Thursday evenings for a total of 24 class hours.

Other courses to be included in the training program are: Hotel-Motel Accounting, Hotel-Motel Law, Introduction to Hotel-Motel Management, Maintenance and Engineering and Communications.

Pre-registrations for this new program will be accepted until noon of March 2nd by calling Cleveland County Technical Institute, 482-4378, Extension 5.

The only cost for each one of the courses will be approximately

\$16.50 which is for the individual manuals and kits furnished by the American Hotel-Motel Ass'n.

The classes will be instructed by Mrs. Elizabeth Miller who has had extensive experience in teaching and placement of participants in this industry.
