**SKILLET SQUASH AND ONIONS**

Wash squash and dice. Combine all ingredients in skillet. Cover and cook for 20 to 30 minutes, or until squash and onions are tender. Stir frequently. Makes four servings.

**FRENCH-FRIED SUMMER SQUASH**

3 EGGS, beaten  
1-2 cup milk  
4 teaspoons salt  
4 medium summer squash, thinly sliced  
2 cups corn meal  
Oil

Combine eggs, milk and salt to make batter. Dip squash in batter; roll in corn meal. Fry in deep fat until done. Yields six servings.

**BAKED STUFFED SQUASH**

1 pound yellow squash  
1 large onion, chopped  
2 tablespoons butter  
Bread crumbs  
Dash of pepper  
Salt to taste

Buttered bread crumbs. Scrub squash and parboil whole until slightly tender. Saute onion in butter. Slice squash in half lengthwise; carefully scoop out insides. Combine onion with enough fresh bread crumbs to absorb excess moisture; mix well. Season with salt and pepper. Fill squash shells; top with buttered bread crumbs. Bake at 325 degrees F. for 10 to 12 minutes or until crumbs are browned. Yields 6-8 servings. Note: add crumbled, crisp bacon, ground ham, or cheese, if available, to stuffing.

## MENTAL HEALTH MATTERS

**ONE TO GROW ON** in promoting positive mental health which prevents mental illness.

As a part of the emphasis being given to child mental health nationally and through local and state community services, the National Institute of Mental Health has launched a new program called "One To Grow On." The program is to help teachers bring mental health to their classrooms. The idea for the program grew out of the basic concern parents, teachers and mental health workers have for decreasing the need for "specialists" by helping to prevent the child from becoming "special" in the first place.

A teacher who is sensitive to the young person's needs and feelings, and appreciates his skills, can provide important help in promoting positive mental health which prevents mental illness.

More time is spent with children and parents by teachers than by any other professional group.

In many instances, the teachers is representative of the community for the child. The school therefore, has the potential to help a child understand his and others' dependencies, feelings, and tears and joy.


Teachers can help children understand why people act as they do. They can help a child develop self-esteem and an understanding of what are good and bad human relations.

Classroom mental health holds the potential for enhancing every child's ability to develop his humanness, skill in decision-making, empathy and concern for other people, self-understanding, and a sense of responsibility.

Although still in the developmental stage, the "One To Grow On" program is planning to include instrumental texts, films, discussion guides, and other materials for which teachers express a need.
