At July 20 meeting of COPE guest speaker was Chief of Police Earl Lloyd Sgt. Richard and Reynolds. Invocation was by Rev. Frank Shirley, pastor of Temple Baptist

Chief Lloyd talked to members about when on patrol what to watch for and how to report. Chief Lloyd pointed out that all citizens are on patrol even while out riding in their cars. "But the hard fact," said the Chief, "is that citizens wouldn't know if a crime was going on or not because they don't notice what is going them in their cars." "If you see something and don't want to report it on the CB, get to a phone and call the Police Department and your name will be kept out of it." Sometimes, it's better to call in by phone rather than use a CB

Chief Lloyd told members about the low major crime rate citizens of Kings Mountain enjoy. Chief Lloyd said the city will have its own base unit in the very near future and return the one that is on loan to the police depart-

Chief Lloyd said he is working on getting a certificate from the city to give CB'ers who help save a life or stop a crime by using their CB in reporting. It will be an award the recipient will be proud of, said the Chief.
