

Damages Run High, But No Injuries Reported

Damages were high but no injuries were reported in numerous car smash-ups which occurred during the city limits during the past week.

Two mishaps involved parked cars. Ptl. Harry Martin said a car operated by David C. Mills, 1014 Second St., and a parked 1969 Dodge were involved in a collision Saturday at 4:27 p. m. on Shockley St. Damages were estimated at \$350 to both cars.

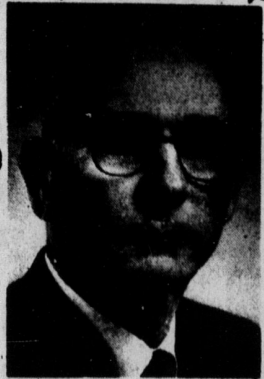
