Monday night Kenneth Bell, a member of the Crawford Murphy architectural firm of Shelby, presented a proposed plan for action by the city's beautification com-

Bell told the board the plan includes a guideline for the commission's use and a method of keeping a written record of projects

"The second part of the manual lists a series of projects for the commission to undertake during the next three to four years," he said. The projects include not only eautification, but studies to prepare the commission for future work, landscaping analysis, which is a general overview of existing problems, and a pedestrian and cyclist

circulation system." Bell said in all there are about 16 projects included in the study. One of these, he said, includes planting a certain type of tree along the Southern Railroad right of way. He said the railroad officials have agreed to allow this work to be done. The architect said the

railroad officials were "impressed" with the amount of work included in the study and how much effort had been expended to ensure the railroad company rights are not

Bell, accompanied by Mrs. George Houser and Mrs. J. E. Herndon, Jr., cochairpersons of the commission, told the board copies of the manual would be made and presented to commissioners for approval or modification at a future meeting.
