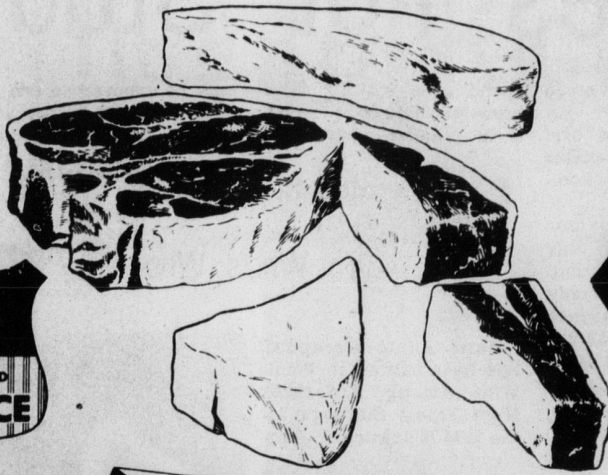

were provided technical assistance through the district. Of this number 250 different co-operators applied at least one conservation practice. Complete conservation plans were developed or revised by 40 owners and operators. More than 2000 acres of minimum tillage or no-till planting was done. More than 1000 acres of pastureland or hayland were seeded. Approximately 266 acres of woodland site preparation and 810 acres of tree planting were done in the county. Approximately 19250 feet of field borders were completed. During the past year, inventories and evaluations were prepared for 26 residential developers, individual land users and industries.

Much progress has been made in the county this year. However, there is much to be done yet in the field of conservation throughout the county.
