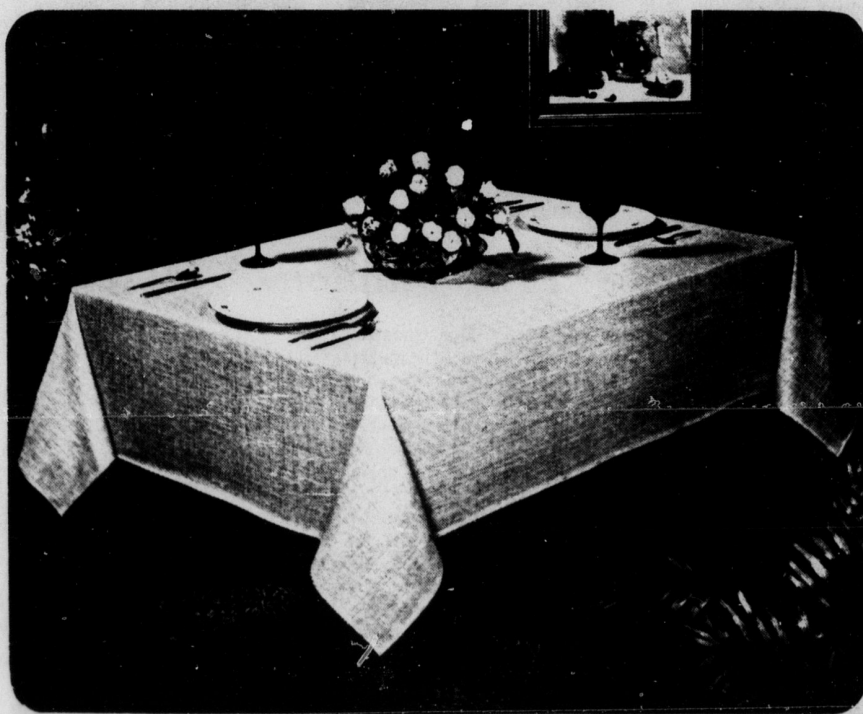
There is no admission to the grounds of the Fair. Automobile parking fee is 50 cents.
