Motion involving a Kings Mountain textile firm is scheduled to be heard in U. S. District Court in Rutherfordton Monday. Judge Withrow Jones will be on the bench.

Mitsui and Co., Inc., plaintiff, has made motion for summary judgment against Carolina Throwing Co., Inc. of Kings Mountain as it seeks a payment of balance due on account. Although trial is slated for Tuesday, spokesmen for Carolina Throwing indicate they believe a continuation may be

granted in the case because of progress made in a settlement.

In a related action, Carolina Throwing, as third party plaintiff, is suing Unifit Inc. That matter will not be heard next week as procedures for arbitration are in effect between the two corporations, said a spokesman.
