Tech, Gardner-Webb Form Cooperative Degree Program

Cleveland Tech. "Many of our students are quite capable of earning the bachelor's degree, but for various reasons, cannot attend class except in the evening. Now they will have an opportunity to continue their education at Gardner-Webb basically on the same schedule they have followed at Cleveland

The two presidents agree that the cooperative program is very much in keeping with the community service philosophy of the two institutions.

"We feel this will minimize the necessity of duplicating course offerings at the two schools, and will greatly enhance the educational opportunities of the community," Williams stated. "I feel this to be a most ap-

propriate partnership between two area institutions which share a common goal, and yet have different institutional characteristics and capabilities."

The first cluster of students will begin their studies at Gardner-Webb College March 29, 1977. Classes will be held four nights a week from 6 to 9:45, Monday through Thursday for six weeks. The cost will be \$40 per semester hour.
