RESOLUTION FIXING DATE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON QUESTION OF ANNEXATION PURSUANT TO G. S. 160A-31, AS AMENDED

Whereas, a petition requesting annexation of the area described herein has been received; and

Whereas, the board of commissioners has a resolution directing the city clerk to investigate the sufficiency thereof; and

Whereas, certification by the city clerk as to the sufficiency of said petition has been made;

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the board of commissioners of the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina:

Section 1. That a public hearing on the question of annexation of the area described therein will be held in Council Chambers at 7:30 p. m. o'clock on the 24th day of January, 1977.

Section 2. The area proposed for annexation is described as follows:

Lying and being in Crowders Mountain Township, Gaston County, North Carolina, and adjacent to the present municipal boundaries of the City of Kings Mountain, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a stake in the Northeasternmost line of Lot No. 120 of the North Woods Subdivision as shown on that certain Map or Plat duly recorded in the Office of the register of Deeds for Gaston County in Plat Book 27 at Page 3 said stake being further situated South 55 degrees 41 minutes East 9.55 feet from the common corner of Lot No. 120 and 121 of the North Woods Subdivision and running thence a new line through the property of W. S. Stinnett North 30 degrees 41 minutes East 355.08 feet to an iron; thence another new line through the property of W. S. Stinnett North 85 degrees 51 minutes East 710.0 feet to an iron; thence another new line through the property of W. S. Stinnett South 04 degrees 09 minutes East 457.41 feet to an iron on the line of J. P. Payne, now or formerly, said iron further being situated 612.51 feet along the old line in a Southwesterly direction from an old iron; thence with the common line of the property belonging to J. P. Payne, now or formerly, South 71 degrees 34 minutes West 649.05 feet to an old iron on the line of Lot No. 97 in the North Woods Subdivision as shown in Plat Book 27 at Page 31; thence with the common line of Lot 97 and Lots 116 through 119 inclusive, North 45 degrees 05 minutes West 359.48 feet to an old iron, said iron being the common corner of Lot 119 and 120 as shown on the aforesaid plat; thence with the common line of Lot 120 North 45 degrees 41 minutes West 72.72 feet to the point of Beginning.
