

Franklin Ware, Manager of the ESC's Shelby Job Service office, stated that UI claimants are informed at the time of their initial claims interview that they are soleluy responsible for maintaining UI records for the contract of the contra

tax purposes.
"Unfortunately, our local office cannot keep track of every claimant's payment record," Ware said. "Moreover, we simply don't have the time or staff to provide claimants with earnings

statements.

To those UI recipients who failed to keep detailed records, Ware suggested that an accurate income figure could be found by multiplying the claimant's weekly benefit amount by the number of weeks he or she received it.

Mr. Ware also pointed out that while unemployment insurance benefits are subject to state income taxes, they are not taxed by the Federal Government.


