## Charges Sent To Grand Jury

Cases charging first degree murder and robbery with a dangerous weapon against Perry Dean Bristol, 20, were sent directly to the grand jury in 27th Judicial Court Wednesday by Judge A. Max Harris.

Bristol is charged with the shooting death and robbery of James Luther Rayfield, 50, Kings Mountain service station operator, on Dec. 18, 1976.

No bond was set for Bristol, who was ordered returned to prison where he is serving a 60-year sentence on another charge, to await trial in Cleveland Superior Court.

Assistant District Attorney Jack H. White said he made the motion to send the cases directly to the grand jury without a preliminary hearing in each case because he "was tired of fooling around to get the public defender's office in court."

The public defender's office had been appointed to defend Bristol as an indigent who could not afford a private attorney.

Preliminary hearings for Bristol had been set for Dec. 20, 1976, Jan. 27, 1977, Feb. 10, 1977 and Feb. 23, 1977, at the request of the defense, according to court records.

Assistant public defender Doug Canty appeared in court to object to the state's motion to send the cases directly to the grand jury. The objection was overruled by Judge Harris who said the state had the right to send a case to the grand jury without a preliminary hearing.
