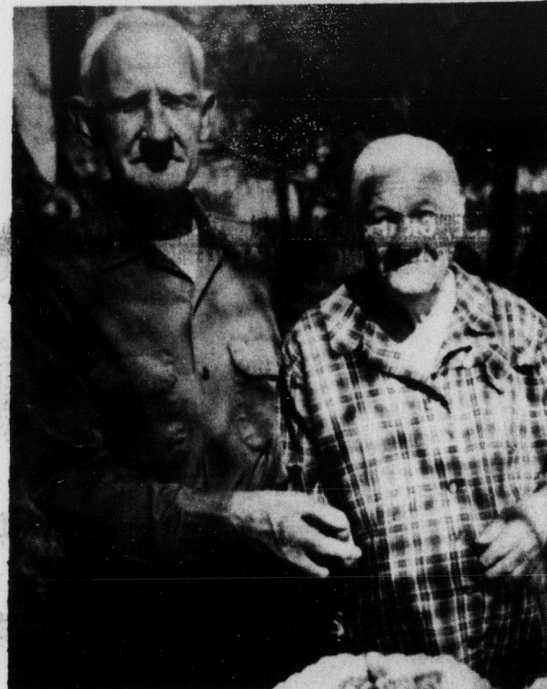
BRIDE AND BRIDEGROOM
