the new president of the Women's Golf Association of Kings Mountain Country Club at the February luncheon meeting Tuesday.

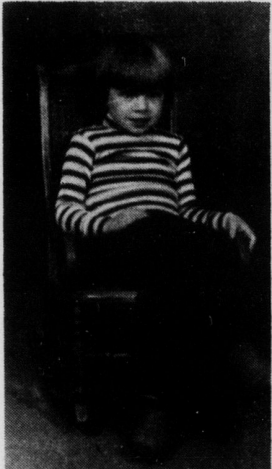
