R-S Game Washed Out

Baseballers At Burns

Kings Mountain High's baseballers return to action today with a nonconference game at Burns.

The Mountaineers' game with R-S Central last Friday was rained out and has been re-set for Wed., March 28.

Both the Mountaineers and Burns will be looking for their first victory today. KMHS lost an earlier 8-5 decision to R-S Central and Burns dropped a 5-4 decision to Shelby in its opener last week.

Coach Barry Gibson is using the non-conference games for experimental purposes, playing as many players as he can in hopes of coming up with a solid nine in time for Southwestern Conference play, which begins March 29 at Bessemer City.

Coach Gibson played 15 layers in last week's loss to R-S Central while the Hilltoppers went with only nine. R-S scored three runs in the bottom of the sixth inning to break a 5-5 tie and win the contest.

Gibson has young, inexperienced players at most positions. But they have a lot of talent and Gibson's hoping they can get in all their nonconference games in order to give the youngsters the needed experience.

Gibson said the Mountaineers need to improve their defense and hit better with men on base. In last week's loss, they made five costly errors and left 10 men stranded on the basepaths. On the other hand, R-S managed only four hits off three KMHS pitchers, but left only three men on base.

Jimmy Hall and David Ray Robinson, a pair of mores, provided half of KM's eight hits (two apiece) and veteran Scott Ellis came through with a key two-run single.

Mountaineers led most of the game but two big innings (three runs in the fourth and sixth) provided the difference for the Hilltoppers.

Burns, coached by a former member of the KMHS staff, Tommy Pruett, is considered as a Division Two contender, even though the Bulldogs lost their opener to Shelby. They have one of the SWC's top pitchers in David Williams, who is
