

A's Open Loop Play Saturday

Kings Mountain's A's open Triple County League play Saturday afternoon at home against the Charlotte Mets.

Coach Bubbles Brown said the playing site for the game hasn't been determined. The A's usually play at Davidson Park but it has been undergoing some repairs, so the game might be switched to Kings Mountain High School.

Alan Lindsay, a left-hander from Cherryville, will start on the mound for the A's, who are trying to move back on top of the league standings after dropping to second place last year. Lindsay is a former All-State high school and legion pitcher in Cherryville and he had a brief stint in professional baseball.

The remainder of the KM lineup will have Darrell Whetstone at first base, Chuck Austin at second, Wayne Bridges at shortstop, Charles Rhodes at third base, James Smith in leftfield, Danny McDowell in center, Charlie Jones in right and Clarence Ash behind the plate.

Whetstone, a righthander, will draw the starting pitching assignment Sunday when the A's travel to Charlotte to play the Westside Eagles.
