

Auto Damages Running High In Rash Of Road Mishaps

Michael Keith Williams, of 313 N. Gaston St., was charged by Ptl. Don Ivey with unsafe movement after the Williams 1969 Chevy collided with a 1972 Chevy operated by Greg McGinnis, of 705 Crescent Circle, Saturday on Second St.

According to the officers report, the Williams car was making a left turn onto Katherine St. Damages were estimated at \$1500 to both cars.

A 1974 Chevy operated by Rodney Short, of 108 Benfield Rd., collided with a schoolbus Monday on Phifer Road when the car apparently made a left turn into the path of the bus, officers reported. The bus, in which 30 children were riding, was operated by Carl Crocker, of Rt. 4. No injuries were reported

and property damages were estimated at \$1500.

Cars operated by Alberta P. Adams, of PO Box 168, and J. C. McGill, Jr. of Rt. 2, hit as the Adams vehicle pulled from a parking space on E. Gold and Cherokee Streets Monday morning. Damages were estimated at \$450, according to Ptl. Mike Sanders.

The Kings Mountain Redevelopment Commission will receive sealed Bids for Kings Mountain Redevelopment Commission Downtown Pedestrian Walkway between Mountain Street and First Union Bank within the Central Business District Project N. C. R-84 until 2 p. m. E. D. T. April 22, 1977 at the office of the Redevelopment Commission located at the rear of 115 West Mountain Street, Kings Mountain, North Carolina at which time all Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

Work consists of furnishing and installing concrete walks, brick paving, brick walls, lighting, benches, landscaping and other items as noted on the Drawings and in the Technical Specifications.

The Project will be constructed under one contract: General Construction.
