## Staff Changes

Are Made

BOILING SPRINGS -Two administrative staff changes have been announced by Gardner-Webb College President Craven

E. Williams. Robert W. Abrams, director of admissions since 1967, has been appointed to the newlycreated position of director of church relations, and Richard M. Holbrook, associate director of admissions, has been named director of admissions, replacing Abrams.

The changes are effec-

tive July 1. According to Williams, the creation of the office of church relations will enable Gardner-Webb "to express more emphatically our kinship with the churches as well as the denomination."

"Gardner-Webb has kept close ties with the church since its beginning, and over the years, a number of people have nurtured this relationship," he explained. "Now we have the opportunity to make this relationship even more vibrant.

A native of Rutherfordton, Abrams received an A. A. degree from Gardner-Webb College and a B. A. degree from Wake Forest University. He was awarded the bachelor of divinity degree by the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He is married to the

A native of Elkin, Holbrook is completing his first year as associate director of admissions. He joined the Gardner-Webb staff in August after two years as director of admissions at Limestone College where he was responsible for recruitment, financial aid and veteran affairs programs.
