Area citizens who are now planting tomatoes will be interested in suggestions from extension specialists on wide selection of tomato varieties to plant.

past years have wilted and died.

If you suspect Granville wilt is a problem in your garden, North Carolina State University extension specialists suggest planting either Venus or Saturn varieties. These were developed at NCSU and are resistant to Granville wilt.

These may not produce a tomato that is quite as large as those of favorites such as Better Boy Hybrid, Manapal or Marion, but they should allow you to produce tomatoes in wilt-prone gardens.

That selection will be narrowed, they said, if the soil is harboring the Granville wilt organism. This bacterial disease is fairly widespread in North Carolina and might be suspected if tomatoes in
