The reception will be held from 2 until 4 p. m. in the Fellowship Hall of Second Baptist Church.



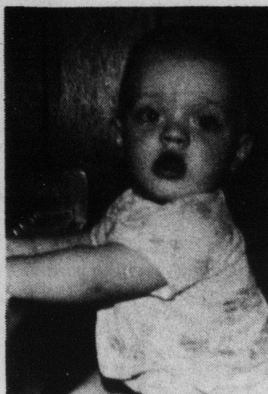

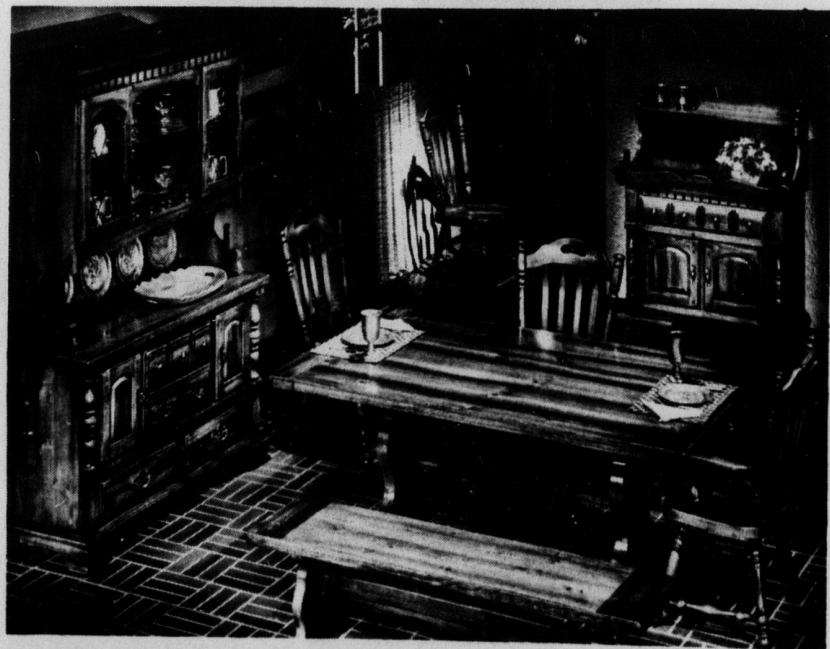

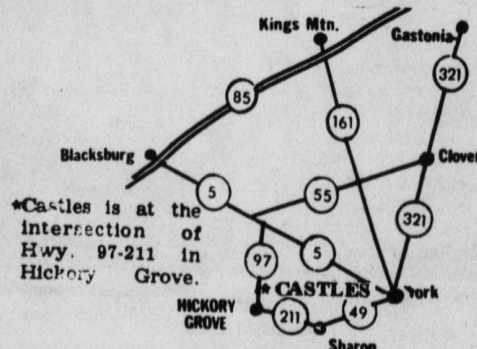
