## Two New Films At KM Park

The Fort Stanwix featurette points out the national significance of the fort in thwarting the western phase of the British plan in 1777 and led to the defeat of Burgoyne at Saratoga.

In the seige of Fort Stanwix lasted 22 days in August 1777.

"Saratoga" depicts the two-day battle in October 1777 and the surrender of Gen. John Burgoyne to Gen. Horatio Gates.

Fort Stanwix is located in Rome, New York and Saratoga at Stillwater, New York. The films will be shown at 9 p. m. both evenings.

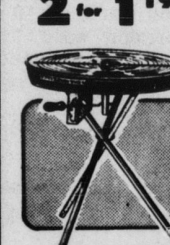

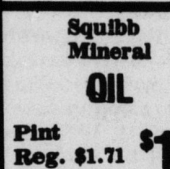
