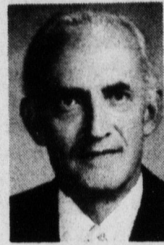
Planters were broken and overturned on downtown streets Monday by vandals, according to report of Kings Mountain Police Department.

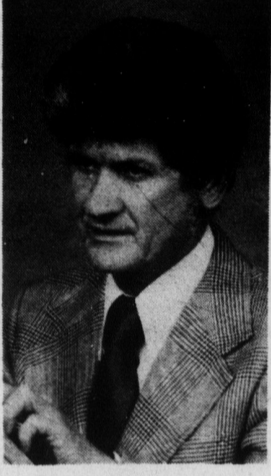
