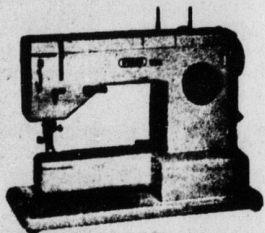


Vehicle Injuries, Damages Reported

Tony Curtis Shank, age nine, of 518 Belvedere Circle, was treated for injuries Thursday after she darted into the path of a car on Belvedere Circle.

Ptl. Mike Sanders said the child had run around the front of

School Bus 68 which had not yet started on rounds to pick up children and into the path of a 1971 Ford operated by Kathy Monica Lewis Haywood, of 528 Belvedere Circle.

Three children escaped injury Saturday when one knocked the family car out of gear and the 1968 Pontiac rolled off the road and through two yards, finally stopping in the rear of a residence on Second St.

Donald M. Paysour, of Rt. 1, Shelby, was listed by KMPD as owner of the vehicle which was parked at 206 Margaret St. on Saturday. The occupants were identified as Carolina Lynn Paysour, age four, Tammie Paysour, age

two; and Michael Paysour, age five. No injuries were reported.

Property damages to the vehicle totaled \$800 to the front end.

Three people were treated for injuries in a two-car crash Sunday on King Street when a 1970 Ford operated by Tim E. Pressley of Harmon Court turned left in front of a west-bound vehicle operated by James A. Summey, of Thomasville.

Both drivers and Ricky Hill, 21, of Thomasville, passenger, along with Pam Couch, 18, in the Summey 1971 Ford, were injured, according to Ptl. B. G. Benton. Damages to the cars were listed at \$1400.

Ptl. R. E. Grindstaff reported that cars operated by Michael L. Mitchell, of 1002 Cleveland Ave., and Doris Hipp Johnson, of 413 York Rd., were involved in a collision Sept. 30 on York Rd. when the 1977 Chevy

operated by Ms. Johnson apparently sideswipped the Mitchell 1972 Ford which was turning into the Little Moo parking lot. Mitchell was proceeding South on York Rd. when Ms. Johnson reportedly started passing on the right hand side of the road. Damages were estimated at \$500.

Ptl. Mike Sanders reported that David E.

Jackson, of Gastonia, operating a 1965 Ford Truck, backed into a stopped 1974 Plymouth operated by Shirley B. Valentine had reported backed from a parking place in front of Plonk's and Jackson was backing up to look in the windows of the department store. Damages were estimated at \$75 to the Valentine car.

Youngster Hurt In Car Accident

David Bryan Bolt, age eight, was admitted to Kings Mountain Hospital with a broken collar bone following an accident Monday afternoon on Linwood Rd.

According to report of investigating Ptl. J. A. Burton, the boy was returning home from school and was walking West on Linwood Road,

reportedly "kicking a can", when he darted into the path of a vehicle operated by Al Smith Dorsey, of 612 Temple St., operating a 1967 Mercury.

The child's father transported the boy to the hospital for treatment.

No charges were preferred.

INVITATION TO BID

Sealed Proposals will be received by the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, in the City Hall, in the Commissioners' Chambers, Kings Mountain, North Carolina, until 3 p. m. October 19, 1977, at which time all bids will be publicly opened and all bid prices read aloud, for the following:

All necessary furnishing of material and labor for the installation and construction of fencing of the Citizens Service Center of the City of Kings Mountain.

No bid shall be considered or accepted by the City of Kings Mountain unless at the time of its filing, the same shall be accompanied by a deposit of cash or certified check on some bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in an amount equal to not less than five percent of the proposal. In lieu of making a cash deposit, the bidder may file a big bond executed by a corporate surety, licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds, conditioned that the surety will, upon demand forthwith, make payment to the obligee upon said bond if the bidder fails to execute the Contract in accordance with the Bid Bond, and upon failure to forthwith make payment, the surety shall pay to obligee an amount equal to double the amount of the bid bond. This deposit shall be retained if the successful bidder fails to execute the Contract within ten (10) days after the award or fails to give satisfactory surety as required herein.

The successful bidder shall be required to enter into a Contract with the City of Kings Mountain in writing and shall be required to furnish bond on some surety company authorized to do business in the State, or make a deposit of money, certified check, or government sureties for the full amount of said Contract for the faithful performance of terms of said Contract as required in Section 148-129 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

Plans, Specifications and Proposal Forms are on file at the Engineering Department, P. O. Box 429, Kings Mountain, North Carolina, 28066. Copies of these plans and specifications may be obtained by bona fide bidders.

No bid can be withdrawn for a period of thirty (30) days after the scheduled closing time for the receipt of bids, and the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive informalities.
