

Mrs. Stoney Speaks At October DAR Meeting

The speaker for the October meeting of the Col. Frederick Hambricht Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution was Mrs. A.B. Stoney, state chairman of the National DAR Museum and secretary of the Southeastern area.

Mrs. Stoney emphasized the historical North Carolina Room located in the Society's Memorial Continental Hall and the importance of support by giving of relics, works of art or other objects that reflect our history.

Mrs. Stoney said she feels that the Society members should put this matter of preservation of our state and national history first in consideration of gifts and that the museum is one of the best means of doing this. The 50,000 works of art, given by individuals, both members and friends, date from 1775.

The North Carolina Room is one of the 28 State Period Rooms that tells the story of local craftsmanship in wood, in silver and in paint. Though the collection is extensive, there are many articles that would give meaning to the state history which are not in the room, but should be.

She said that Tryon Palace at New Bern is another source of historical interest. It is considered one of the loveliest national landmarks in the U.S.

The Museum and the state rooms are open to the public Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. In recent years one third of the visitors have been men. Three sets of films are available for rent at a charge of \$3.
