Tractor Buy Decisions Shifting Toward Diesel

Fuel consumption is just as important in selecting a farm ractor as it is in buying a family car. Farmers will be paying more attention to this the post-harvest tractor trading season arrives.

An important factor lated to tractor fuel costs s been the change in the lative cost of gasonne and dieseled-fueled tractors, according to North Carolina State University extension

ngineers. The price difference between diesel and gas-powered has been decreasing. Diesel engine small tractors and tractors used on a limited basis are more practical, compared to gasoline tractors, than they were in the

Generally, a diesel tractor will save both fuel and money. In most farming situations, the potential for recapturing the additional in-

vestment is excellent. Diesels are more efficient isers of fuel than gasoline

> engines. A diesel engine consumes about 70 per cent as much fuel per unit of work as a gasoline engine. This is due to the diesel's higher air compression ratio in the cylin-

> The diesel's higher compression ratio results in a more powerful piston stroke, but it also requires the diesel to be made stronger than gas-

Because the diesel must be stronger, it has traditionally been more expensive. The decision to buy a diesel was often based on whether the additional expense would be recaptured through fuel sav-ings. Now the difference between the initial cost of gasoline and diesel tractor is decreasing, which means that the hours of use required to make a diesel as economical as a gasoline tractor are decreasing.

The decision to buy diesel or gasoline tractors appears to be shifting more in favor of the diesel.
