

Woman Killed In Grover

A Lincoln County woman, Mrs. Terrie H. Hill, 21, was killed and a Grover area man, Garris Eugene Philbeck, 29, was injured in a train-car wreck on Road 2233 at the Southern Railway crossing off Highway 29 at Grover at 6:10 p. m. Saturday, according to Trooper J. L. Evans of the N. C. Highway Patrol.

Ptl. Evans said that Mrs. Hill, of Rt. 1, Lincolnton, was killed when a car

operated by Philbeck stalled on the railroad track and was hit by a Southern Railway train. Philbeck was hospitalized for injuries at Kings Mountain Hospital.

The engineer of the train, M. D. Westmoreland, of Greenville, S. C., was quoted by Evans as saying the car was apparently stalled at the railroad crossing as the train approached. He said he

blew the train whistle in an attempt to warn the driver of the train's approach.

Philbeck was quoted as saying that as he entered the crossing he did not see the train because of fogged windows in his car. He said he attempted to back off the track, when he saw the train but was unable to move back, according to the patrol report.

Kings Mountain and Grover rescue squads went to the scene.

Funeral services for Mrs. Hill, who was employed by KM Knitting Co. were conducted Tuesday at 2 p. m. from Reepsville Baptist Church of Lincolnton, interment following in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Hill is survived by her husband, Ricky B. Hill of Rt. 4, Lincolnton, her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bob Heavner of Lincolnton; one son, Jason Lee Hill of the home; one daughter, Kim Heavner of the home; and four brothers, Bobby Heavner, Jr., Danny Heavner, Jeff Heavner and Bryan Heavner, all of Lincolnton.

Hoyle, operating a 1970 Ford, was making a right turn into a driveway off York Rd. when the Jacobs 1972 Chevy attempted to pass on the right and struck the Hoyle vehicle. Damages were estimated at \$600 to the Hoyle car and \$375 to the Jacobs vehicle.

Rebecca B. Cox, of 911 Linwood Dr., employe of Kings Mountain Hospital, reported to Ptl. Tom Gladden that while she was at work Monday her 1971 Chevy, parked in the hospital parking lot, was struck on the left fender by another vehicle. Owner of the hit and run vehicle failed to report the accident to KMPD. Estimated damages to the parked car were \$150.

Tuesday Wreck Causes \$1,300 In Damages

Damages were high in a two-car crash Tuesday night on Cleveland Avenue.

Ptl. James Camp, who investigated, said a 1973 Pontiac operated by Ted Gantt, of Rt. 1 Crouse, struck the back of a 1964 Ford operated by Craig Hawkins, of 413 Broad St., as the Hawkins car was stopping on Cleveland Ave. According to Ptl. Camp, Mr. Gantt said he saw the other motorist stopping but applied brakes and his car skidded.

Damages were estimated at \$1000 to the Gantt car and \$300 to the Hawkins vehicle.

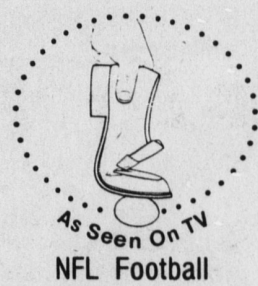

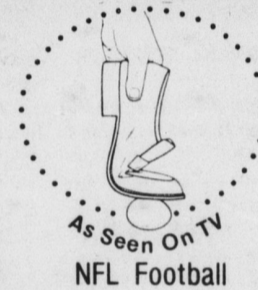

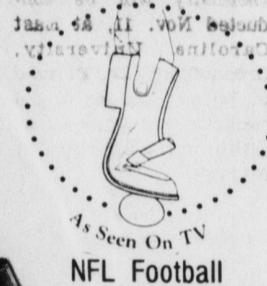
