

# You Can Plan Retirement

If you need to plan your retirement and have been even putting off thinking about it, you'd better act before retirement age catches up with you.

That's the word from Dr. Larry Sale, new director of continuing education and summer school at Gardner-Webb College.

The College is presenting a new series of seminars about how to plan for

retirement. The seminars begin January 17 and continue each Tuesday evening from 7 to 9 p. m. for ten weeks. Social Security personnel and the Gardner-Webb faculty will conduct the course, which offers two continuing education credits (CEU's).

The seminars are on topics like: questions and answers about the Social Security programs, pension plans; health maintenance and health insurance; taxes, savings and investments; housing and budgeting; estate planning and wills; owner-

ship and disposal of real estate; inheritance laws and rights of the spouse; leisure time and future planning.

To defray expenses, the cost of the seminars is \$10. Those who wish to pre-register may send in their names, address, telephone

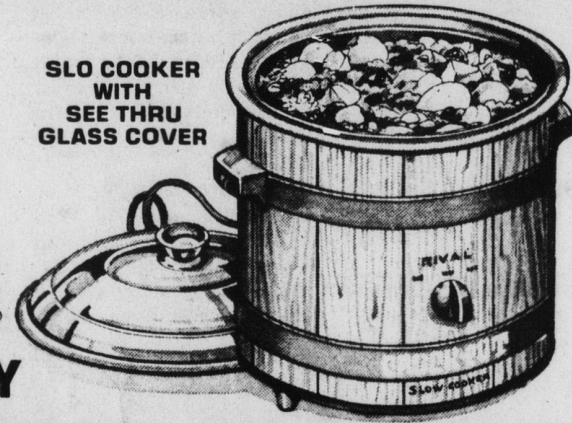
