As long as she was physically able, she gave untold hours of help in person, and by correspondence to seekers

from other states for genealogical information.

"In deed and in truth, she was an example of the purpose of the Society as stated in paragraph 3 of the objects of the Society: 'To cherish, maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom, to foster the patriotism and love of country and to aid in securing for mankind all the blessings of liberty.'"

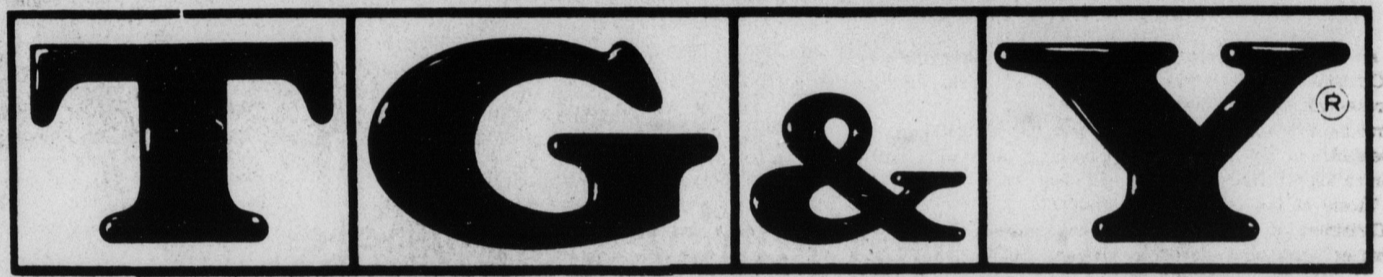

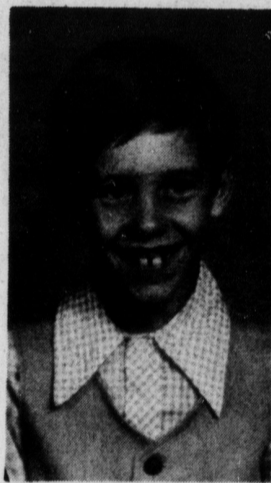
