

# Ingram At G-W Today

John Ingram, the controversial insurance commissioner of North Carolina, will speak on the campus of Gardner-Webb College today (Mar. 2) at 8 p. m. in room 101 of the Science Building.

The honor society, Alpha Chi, is sponsoring the event.

Ingram gained some notoriety and even some popularity by bucking the multi-million insurance industry in the state. The legislature circumvented Ingram's powers earlier in the year by allowing for insurance companies to file their rates and immediately put them into

use without prior approval of the insurance commissioner. The insurance companies had complained that Ingram ignored or denied all their requests for increased rates and they were being

driven out of the state financially. Ingram contended that the insurance companies were already charging unjustifiably high rates and didn't need further increases.
