

North Carolina Association of Educators from public schools to private (NCAE) has joined a lawsuit attempting to block the expenditure of public funds in Gaston County on a private school, according to NCAE President Linda Rader.

After a vote of its Board of Directors, NCAE has filed a friend of the court brief in support of James F. Hughey against the Gaston County Commissioners. Attorney James Fuller filed the brief in Wake County Superior Court.

Hughey is appealing a ruling by Superior Court Judge Sam J. Ervin III that an appropriation of \$48,068 by the Gaston County Commissioners to the private Dyslexia School of North Carolina was for a legitimate public purpose.


