COOKEVILLE, Tenn. — Tennessee Tech's Butch Blalock, a 6-1 senior guard from Kings Mountain, N. C., made his final appearance as a Golden Eagle Saturday (Feb. 25) night in Tech's 72-64 season-ending win over East Tennessee.

A co-captain for the 1977-78 season, Blalock posted a 13.0 scoring mark this season and had a 11.1 career average.

"Butch had an excellent

year scoring for us," said Tech Head Coach Cliff Malpass. "He came on strong late in the season and closed out his career by leading us in scoring against East Tennessee. He was also a good co-

captain this season and provided needed leadership for some of our younger players.

Blalock formerly played at Kings Mountain High School and at Spartanburg (S. C.) Junior College.

The Mountaineers lost a practice match to Lincolnton Tuesday at KMCC, Lincolnton scoring 321 to 329 for KMHS.

Darrell Forbes led the KM effort with a one-over-par 73 but he was the only KM player to break 80. Delk Hagler scored 88, Sammy Wolfe 86 and Mike Howze 87.

The Mountaineers played without last year's number two player, Darrell Austin, who failed to qualify in a nine-hole round Monday.

"I was pleased," noted Guy. "Huss had all of their players back except maybe for one or two, and we got a chance to let everybody play in one form or another."

After winning five of six singles matches to clinch the victory, Guy made some changes in his doubles lineup in order to give some of the younger players experience.

## CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN, NORTH CAROLINA INVITATION TO BID

Sealed Proposals will be received by the City of Kings Mountain, North Carolina, in the City Hall, in the Commissioners Chambers, Kings Mountain, North Carolina, until 3:00 p. m. March 21, 1978 at which time all bids will be publicly opened and all bid prices read aloud, for the following:

Pre-cast pre-stressed concrete double tee sections to be used for stadium bleachers at Davidson Street Park. Nine rows of seats approximately 260 feet in length.

No bid shall be considered or accepted by the City of Kings Mountain unless at the time of its filing, the same shall be accompanied by a deposit of cash or certified check on some bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in an amount equal to not less than five percent of the proposal. In lieu of making a cash deposit, the bidder may file a bid bond executed by a corporate surety, licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds, conditioned that the surety will, upon demand forthwith, make payment to the obligee upon said bond if the bidder fails to execute the Contract in accordance with the Bid Bond, and upon failure to forthwith make payment, the surety shall pay to obligee an amount equal to double the amount of the bid bond. This deposit shall be

retained if the successful bidder fails to execute the Contract within ten (10) days after the award or fails to give satisfactory surety as required herein.

The successful bidder shall be required to enter into a Contract with the City of Kings Mountain in writing and shall be required to furnish bond on some surety company authorized to do business in the State, or make a deposit company authorized to do business in the State, or make a deposit of money, certified check, or government securities for the full amount of said Contract for the faithful performance of terms of said Contract as required in Section 148-129 of the General Statutes of North Carolina.

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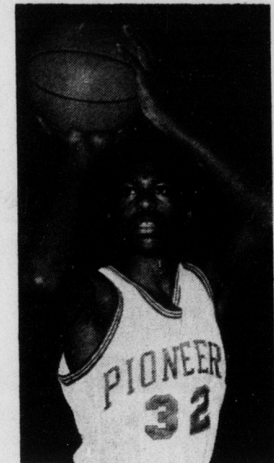
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
