

Volunteer Tea Held At Grover

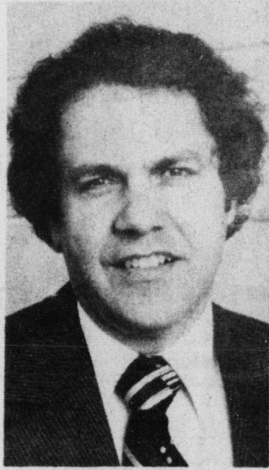
Grover School's first "Volunteer Tea" was held Tuesday in the school library and an enthusiastic group of parents and other school supporters turned out.

Pre-School Screening Set

Pre-school screening for students entering classes in 1978, has been scheduled for April, according to Howard Bryant, director of instruction.

The dates and schools are as follows: Bethware, Thurs., Apr. 13; Grover,

Mon., Apr. 17; East, Wed., Apr. 19; West, Thurs., Apr. 20; and North, Mon., Apr. 24.

Three sessions per day at each school have been set from 9:10:30 a. m., 10:30 a. m.-noon; and 1-2:30 p. m.

Named To Dean's List

Karen Leigh Hinton, music education major at Mars Hill College, has been named to the fall

term dean's list. Karen is the daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. Russell L. Hinton of Kings Mountain.

Children with last names beginning with the letters A-H are asked to attend the 9:10:30 a. m. session; those with last names that begin with the letters I-P, the 10:30 a. m.-noon session; and others, the 1-2:30 p. m., session. If this particular time and date schedule is unsatisfactory for someone, changes in time and schools will be permitted.

Bryant said, "All children who will enter

school for the first time are expected to attend with their parents one of the sessions listed above. In addition to the forms for registering the child, the school must have a copy of the child's birth certificate (not the hospital record), his 'shot' record, and a copy of the physical examination by the family doctor or the health department."

During the screening session parents will participate in an orientation

program and conferences with the social worker and principal. Some 350 children are expected to participate in the screening.

Bryant said children who will be five years old on or before Oct. 15, 1978, will be eligible to enter kindergarten; those who will be six years old on or before Oct. 15, 1978 will be eligible for kindergarten or the first grade.

Completes Training

During the eight-week training cycle, trainees studied general military subjects designed to prepare them for further academic and on-the-job training in one of the

Navy's 85 basic occupational fields.

Included in their studies were seamanship, close order drill, Naval history and first aid. Personnel who complete this course of instruction are eligible for three hours of college credit in Physical Education and Hygiene.

A 1975 graduate of Kings Mountain Senior High School, he joined the Navy in January 1978.

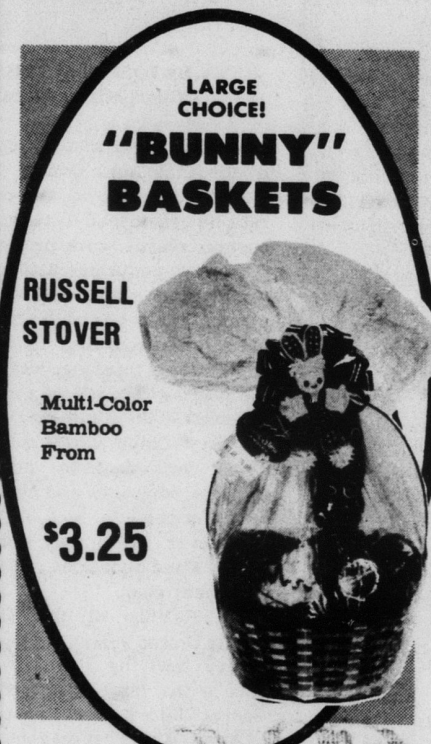

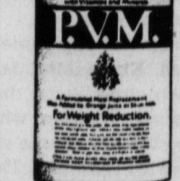
