## Eaton Introduces Service Packaging

Eaton Corporation on its first anniversary at its Grover Rd. plant Tuesday introduced a second phase, service packaging, at its Transmission Division Plant.

John Major, plant manager, announced that Eaton has recently been designated as the production and shipping point for the division's service parts. New equipment and physical layout has been installed and shipping of pre-boxed and Eaton overhaul kits is now taking place to all major truck builders in the United States and overseas.

Along, with this new expansion in production capabilities, according to Major, the plant supplies two of the major lines of transmissions, RT-9513

and 9509, to customers such as International Harvester, GMC, Freightliner, Ford and Mack trucks. Many of the units are being exported overseas for use in foreign made trucks.

Major said the assemblyline production packages nearly one per minute, 59 per hour, and 85 transmissions go out from the plant on a daily basis.

Anticipated production at the Kings Mountain facility is expected to be greatly strengthened, said Major, with this new capability.
