All classes will be held at Joy's Arts and Crafts, formerly Goody-Goody - Barbecue on Shelby Rd.

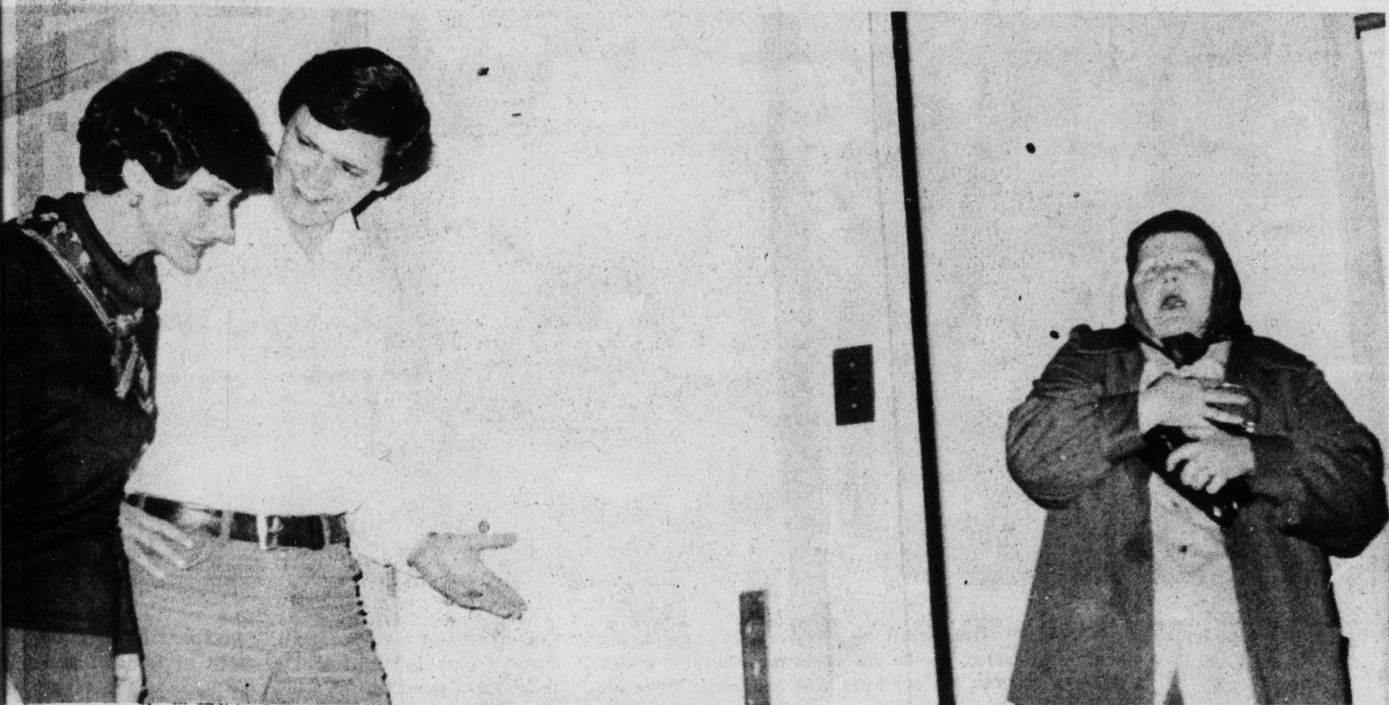
