Use Emergency Number

County Commissioner L. E. (Josh) Hinnant said this week he has received complaints from citizens who reported being unable to reach anyone at the Kings Mountain Rescue Squad at night.

Larry Revels said the matter has been brought to his attention and he urges "citizens to make use of the Cleveland County Emergency

Services number in these cases." The emergency services dispatcher sets off the tones in the rescue squad volunteer's homes for night calls, Revels said.

The Kings Mountain Rescue Squad has three fulltime EMT's on duty five days each week and volunteers handle calls at nights and on weekends. Revels said if citizens

have been unable to reach rescuers at the office number at night it is probably because the on duty men have gone to answer other calls.

The emergency services number is 482-4422.

"It is good for citizens to memorize this number or keep it handy for use even during the day," Revels said.

Investigations Underway

Kings Mountain police are continuing investigations of an early-morning Sunday robbery and several break-ins.

Jeff Carroll, 72, of Apt. 26 Pine Manor, told KMPD he was robbed by three young males in his apartment early Sunday. According to police reports, Carroll said he had left his apartment door open by mistake and sometime between 2 and 3 a. m. the intruders entered.

One reportedly grabbed Carroll and covered his eyes while another put a gun to his chest. The third subject reportedly took Carroll's wallet which contained \$30 and a \$61 state tax refund check. Carroll reported the robbery to police Monday morning.
