

Don Kistler Will Speak On Thursday

Don Dye Kistler will speak at the Kings Mountain Community Center Thurs., Apr. 6 at 7 p. m.

Kistler's appearance was scheduled because of the demand from local and area citizens interested in his religious work.

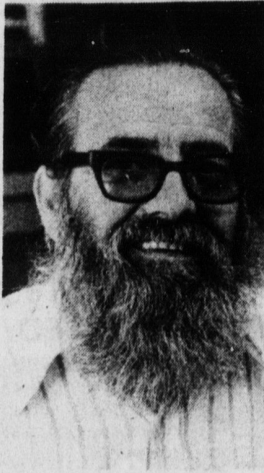
Non-denominational, Kistler operates God's Community Church of Charity and handles publication of religious books and newsletters with worldwide circulation from Kings Mountain.

In his program Thursday, Kistler will speak on the Jews of Israel, the country, prophesy and his book, "The Arithmetic of God." He also has slides from his tour hosting trips to The Holy Land to present.

"The Arithmetic of God" has been leased by Bantam Books for 10 years and will be on the June-July-August publication list. The book will be translated into eight languages for worldwide distribution.

Coming off the press Apr. 21 will be the second of three books Kistler plans. The new book is entitled "The Father and Sons Shall Be One." He is currently working on the third book, "The First Resurrection."

Kistler said it has taken seven years to put the

three books together and that the text of the books were "revealed to me by God during a nine month period in 1971." Kistler said he spent that nine months in a small building about a mile and a half from his home and family in Denver, Colo. "meditating and fasting."

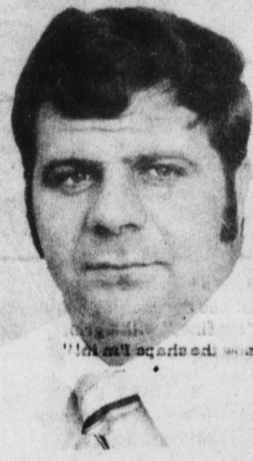
In 1973 Kistler was listed in Who's Who in Colorado and for 1976-77 was listed in Personalties of The South. He came to this area in 1974. A resident of Gastonia, Kistler operated a shoe repair business from a converted bus in

Kings Mountain until six months ago when zoning laws forced him out. He currently operates his "world-wide ministry," he said, from a trailer office behind Trammell and Associates offices in Kings Mountain. He is a member of the KM Kiwanis Club and a tour host. He makes three trips annually to Israel as a guide.

In demand as a speaker, Kistler has recently traveled to Boston and both US Space Centers at Huntsville and Titusville. He has appeared several times on the PTL TV Network program and will fill a request to appear as a guest on The 700 Club, a religious-based TV program originating in Virginia and being shown all over the country.

Roy Pearson, Kings Mountain Recreation Director and in charge of the community center, invited Kistler to speak because of the requests from area citizens to hear him.

"We would like to invite all interested citizens to come to the community center this Thursday to hear Kistler," Pearson said. "He has a story to tell and one the public should hear."

Sanders Is Named Prevention Officer

Mike Sanders, a four-year veteran of the Kings Mountain Police Department, has been named Crime Prevention Officer.

Sanders replaces Houston Corn, who has returned to regular police duties.

Sanders is a native of

Kings Mountain and is married to the former Anita Montgomery, also of Kings Mountain. They have two sons, Jimmy, 8, and Shannon, 6, and reside at 106 Fulton Dr.

Sanders has completed about 600 hours of basic police science courses and is a qualified breathalyzer operator for the local department. In June he will attend two weeks of orientation courses in crime prevention at the Criminal Justice Academy in Salemburg.

Sanders plan to publish helpful information on crime prevention each week in The Mirror Herald. The first article follows:

Studies by local law enforcement agencies and the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration have proved that burglaries can be prevented by deterrence, delay and detection.

Over 75 percent of all burglaries require forcing a door or window to gain entry. Most houses and apartments are protected by simple and ineffective door and window locks. Modern hardware is available for door and window locks which will stop the amateur burglar and slow up the experienced burglar.

Most burglars are young and commit crimes of opportunity. In 1976, 84 percent of all persons arrested for burglary were under 26 years of age.

Sound residential security practices and good locks are a deterrent since they eliminate the opportunity for an easy burglary.

Delaying a burglar for four minutes is generally considered sufficient to prevent entry into a house or apartment. A burglar wants to avoid being caught, so the longer it takes to force a door or window the greater his risk. The burglar wants to avoid making noise — like breaking glass or smashing doors — and he wants to avoid attracting attention. It is nearly impossible to make a house or apartment impregnable — but it is relatively easy and inexpensive to make forced entry difficult and to delay the burglar.
